

**Addendum to the notice of the result of the Written-cum-Screening Examination.**

This is to inform all the concerned candidates that the result of the Written-cum-Screening Examination, held on 07.09.2025 and declared on 10.09.2025, has been prepared after considering the change in the answer key as per the clarification reproduced below:

**Correction in Answer Key – Written-cum-Screening Test for Assistant Professor (Law)**

The following correction has been made by the Expert committee in the official Answer Key of the Written-cum-Screening Test for the post of *Assistant Professor (Law)(Contractual)*:

**Question No. 18**

*"Malice in fact means a wrongful act done intentionally –"*

- **Options:**
  - (A) without evil motive
  - (B) with evil motive
  - (C) without any just cause or excuse
  - (D) with good motive
- Earlier Answer Key Response: (C) without any just cause or excuse
- Corrected Answer: (B) with evil motive

**Reasoning:**

There exists a doctrinal distinction between *malice in fact* and *malice in law*.

- ***Malice in fact*** (also called express malice) means doing an act with ill will, spite, or evil motive.
- ***Malice in law*** (also called implied malice) means doing a wrongful act without just cause or excuse, irrespective of personal motive.

Accordingly, the corrected answer to Question No. 18 is Option (B) with evil motive.
